



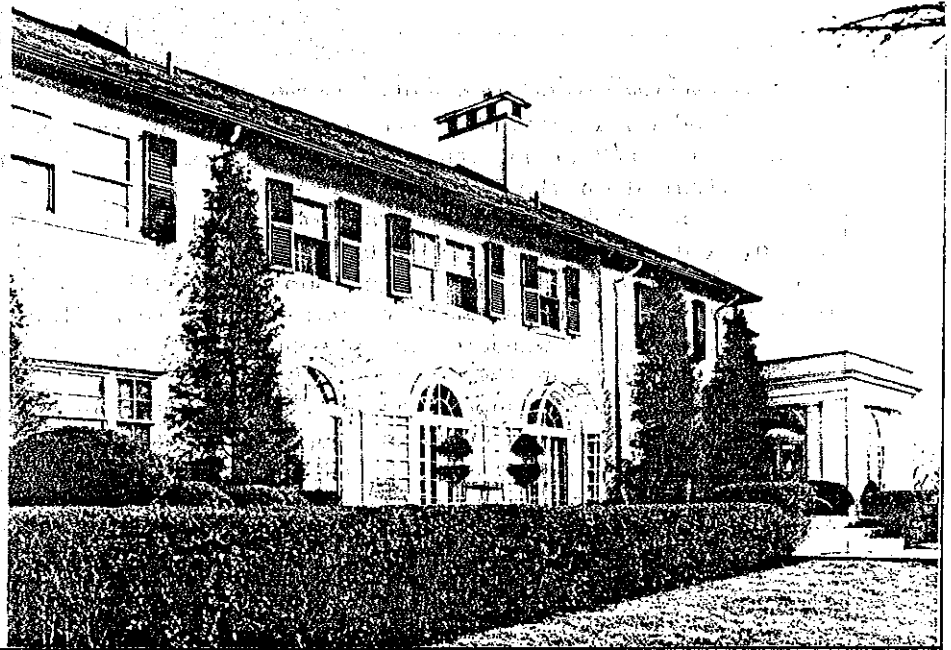
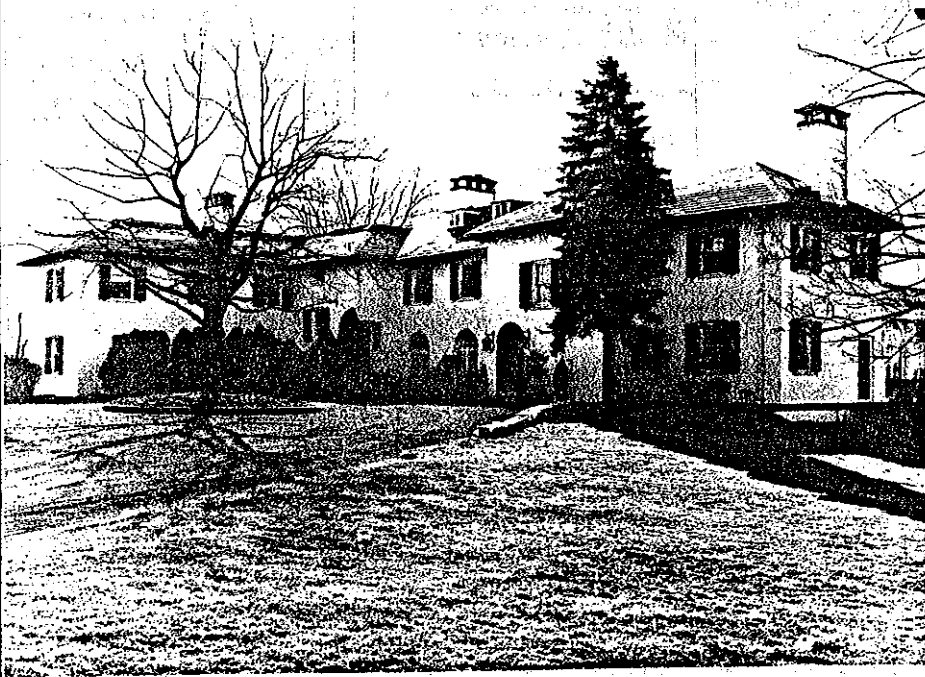

24. photo notation 003-100-R -F2-4		26. brief description (note unusual features, integrity, environment, threats and associated buildings) Sited on a private drive off of Pink House Road overlooking a valley to the N, this is a 2 1/2 story stucco house with a slate hip roof. Its 4 stucco chimneys are indicated on the site plan. A central 5 x 2 bay rectangular portion has a 3 x 1 bay wing appended on the S end, and projecting sunporches. The three central bays of the house on both E and W elevations contain French doors beneath fanlights on the first story. The main door, located on the E elevation, is in a flanking bay. Second story windows are predominantly d/s (6/6). There are several banks of casement windows on the first story. The one-story sunporches on the W elevation have French doors on three sides and flanking attached columns supporting a dentilled cornice and flat roof. Associated buildings: SE of the house along the road, is a smaller stucco building which has been renovated as a residence. (continue on back if necessary)
